• Illawar systen		<ul> <li>Weather alert system – escalates our controls</li> <li>General discussion was held re the suggestion of a Corporate sponsored air monitoring system for the whole of the Illawarra – similar to Newcastle.</li> <li>It was suggested that this meeting could be used as a sounding board – re changes in the future industrial precinct</li> <li>It was noted that this is a much broader than the scope of this CCC meeting and could possibly be co-ordinated/facilitated by the EPA.</li> <li>EPA, BlueScope and others have had preliminary discussions on this topic.</li> <li>Currently there are 3 government monitors within the Illawarra region</li> <li>It was suggested this could be a future agenda item to provide input to the broader program.</li> </ul>	
• Night t	ime emissions	<ul> <li>Discussion was held re the visual appearance of the night sky from Wollongong City to Warrawong; and the possibility of more emissions going into the atmosphere at night.</li> <li>Matt Imber confirmed that there is differences in the visual appearance of the distribution of emissions at night compared to the day (eg. lighting/weather); but explained it was visual only; and that BlueScope operated the plant 24/7 (ie. Operates continually and doesn't have the capacity to ramp up/down production at different times) and monitors its emissions continuously to meet its Environmental licence conditions.</li> </ul>
