Sinter Plant By-Pass

- Extensive investigations between 2020 and 2021 showed the PCDD/F concentration can be minimised by altering the ore blend addition to the raw materials bed.
- >80 samples have been analysed with the alteration and all results were less than the licence limit (0.3ng/Nm³).
- A raw materials bed with the same composition as the bypass period was consumed and tested in April. All results were below 0.3ng/Nm³.
- PCDD/F sampling of the bypass bed was undertaken for 5 days prior to converting to bypass configuration. All results were below 0.3ng/Nm³.
- Amendments to EPL 6092 include:
- Increased frequency of PCDD/F testing
- Clarifying note added regarding sample location and results calculation
- Reduction in minimum sampling time required for PCDD/F
- Results will publicly available on BlueScope's website (www.bluescopeillawarra.com.au)

Processing Coke Ovens Gas Residue

- Condensate that drops out and recycled. Build up of solids. Looking to recycle the solids through our system.
- A trial was approved by EPA to transform the COG solids into a slurry and recycle the liquid through the Gas Processing plant via the COG tanks. The trial will involve recycling 3 x 200kg drums of stored COG Solids through Gas Processing COG Condensate system, a week apart - EPA tracking

Water Stewardship

- Part of one of the principal components of Responsible Steel
- BSL one of founding members. BSL are hoping to receive certification
