

No.6 Blast Furnace Reline Transport Access Guide

Your guide to getting to the No. 6 Blast Furnace Reline project site at Port Kembla Steelworks. Please note that all employees, contractors and visitors must have a proxy card or visitors pass to enter the site. If you are not inducted, you will need to be escorted on site.

Train – Trains frequent stations close to the Port Kembla Steelworks, including Lysaghts, Cringila and Port Kembla North. To get to the No.6 Blast Furnace Reline Site take the South Coast Line (SCO) to Cringila Station. Either walk in from Cringila Station through the pedestrian turnstile (requires a proxy card) or arrange to be picked up from the Cringila Station.

Bus – Buses can be used to gain access to several of the main entry/exit points to the Port Kembla Steelworks site. To catch a bus to the No.6 Blast Furnace Reline site alight at Cringila Station (either side of Five Islands Road). Services to catch include: 27SC, 51, 53, S140, S145, S184, S213 and S260. Either walk in from Cringila Station through the pedestrian turnstile (requires a proxy card) or arrange to be picked up from the Cringila Station.

Taxi/Uber – Taxi and Uber services can be used to gain access to the main entry/exit points to the Port Kembla Steelworks site. However, they are not permitted to drive beyond the access gates. The closest drop-off point to the No.6 Blast Furnace Reline Site is Cringila Station and either walk in from Cringila Station through the pedestrian turnstile (requires a proxy card) or arrange to be picked up from the station.

Parking – Parking is either in Cringila Car Park (off Five islands Road) or Central Car Park with access through the Loop Road boom gate (requires proxy card). Employees and contractors are to walk in from these car parks as parking is very limited inside the steelworks. The walk to the Reline Village from Central Car Park or the Cringila Station turnstile is approximately 10-15 minutes. The marked walkway is not undercover so an umbrella or wet weather gear is required on rainy days. A number of the site contractors provide transport from either Cringila Car Park or Central Car Park.

Cycling – Cycling is a great way to get out and about. There are various cycle pathways in and around the Illawarra community which can be used to access the Port Kembla Steelworks site. There is a cycle pathway that runs past Cringila Station. As the Port Kembla Steelworks has very large oversize vehicles that frequent the various internal roads cycling is not permitted on internal roads for your own safety. Cyclists are required to walk their bike in from Cringila Station through the pedestrian turnstile (requires a proxy card) to the No.6 Blast Furnace Reline Village. There are bike racks provided at the Reline Village. You will need to provide your own bike lock.

Walking – Walking can easily be combined with other active travel options like trains and buses.
